What adoption means, the four pathways, and how to represent the NSRA accurately

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What adoption means

Adopting the NSRA means sponsoring, co-sponsoring, or campaigning on its text. It does not require endorsement of TheAmericanDeal, Inc. The statutory text is published free for public use.

The four pathways

- Full Framework Adoption — integrated platform or introduction-ready package.
- Congressional Introduction — legislative-counsel review, scoring, referral, introduction.
- Title or Policy-Node Adoption — a single title, preserving its fiscal and enforcement dependencies.
- Platform Adoption — a governing platform for candidates and caucuses, not represented as introduced federal legislation.

Dependency labels

Every title carries one: Standalone · Portable with amendments · Requires Schedule G funding · Requires FMIA · Requires SIRF · Requires companion enforcement · Integrated (separation not recommended). Removing a benefit from its funding or enforcement changes its fiscal effect; request an Amendment Impact Memorandum before severing a provision.

Accurate representation

- Cite fiscal figures as NSRA model estimates with scoring pending — do not describe them as official CBO/JCT scores.
- Statutory parameters (e.g., \$35 insulin cap, 50-unit housing cap) may be cited as bill text.
- Do not represent a title as "introduced" unless it has been formally introduced.

Canonical version

The version published in the official NSRA legislative repository controls over summaries, campaign materials, third-party descriptions, and archived drafts.

Evidence standard: Fiscal and impact figures are NSRA model estimates built on published CBO, JCT, OMB, GAO, Treasury, SSA, OECD, and peer-reviewed baselines — internally modeled and sensitivity-tested, not yet officially scored by CBO or JCT, which is pending and welcomed. Statutory parameters (e.g., the \$35 insulin cap, the 50-unit corporate housing cap) are the text of the bill, not projections.
